This story has wonderful pictures for you to look at – talk about what you see on the farm, discuss where Rosie walks, and keep an eye out on that fox!!!



Craft time:

After listening to the story 'Rosie's Walk' discuss prepositions (under, over, on, in, below, around ...).

Place some items around the home. Play a game where your child has to follow one, then two step instructions to find an item.

USE anything you have at home to create a HEN PUPPET!

Encourage your child to retell the story of "ROSIE'S WALK" using the hen puppet (even if you replay the story via the link).

Allow your child to have **FUN**, but with some direction!

Allow your child to **follow simple instructions.**

WHY do we do craft? To develop fine motor skills.

They could draw, cut, print, collage, paint, colour, glue and so on to create their hen puppet.










What we used:





- * We used an **old cereal box**, to **draw the template** of the hen.
- * Your child can use markers to design patterns on the different parts of the hen.
- * Use **cutting skills** to cut some or all of the hen, with your assistance if required.
- * We then taped the hen on a ruler, but a **stick** of some sort would be fine.
