



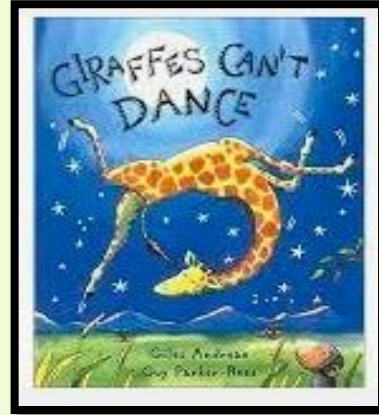
TAPS Transition @Home : Term 4 2021, Week 3 (20th October 2021)

Allow your child to **follow simple instructions**.

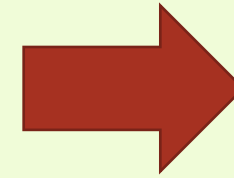
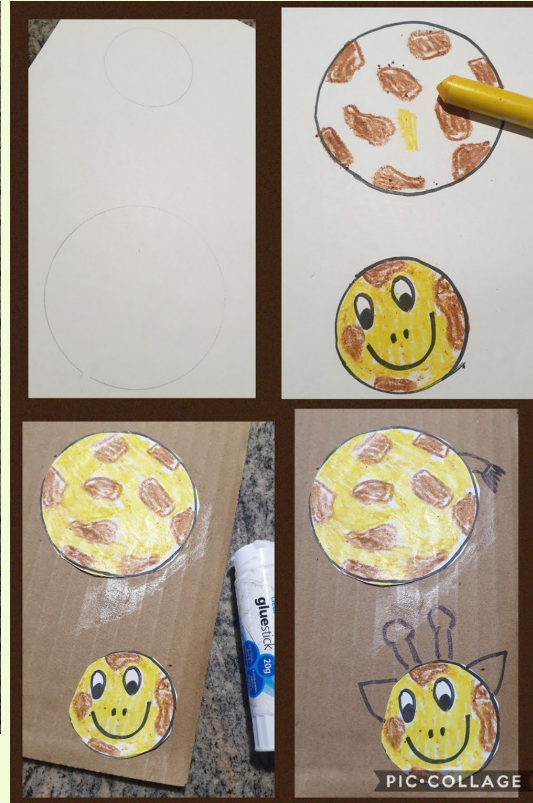
WHY do we do craft? **To develop fine motor skills.**
