As I've been preparing for the 2021 Annual School Report and I found this Data to celebrate & consider. Thanks Parents for appreciating us.

Data – Tell Them From Me Surveys - Parents rank us highly – consistently

- 2021 (83 parents completed) ranked school above state average in all areas.
- 2020 (16 parents completed) ranked above in safety at school and parents doing learning from home.
- 2019 (29 parents completed) ranked school above state average in all areas.
- 2018 (94 parents completed) ranked school above state average in all areas.
- 2017– (24 parents completed) ranked school above state average in all areas.

Data – Improvement in NAPLAN reading 2022 – what we need to focus on

- Year 5 Reading 12.2% increase in top 2 bands
- Year 5 Numeracy 8.3% increase in top 2 bands
- Year 3 Reading 9% decrease in top 2 bands increase in upper mid bands
- Year 3 Reading 8% decrease in top 2 bands increase in upper mid bands
- Understanding Texts e.g. inferences .. vocabulary ... phonics (younger years)
- Number concepts Quantifying Number (number sense) / Additive Strategies working Mathematically (problem solving kind of) Big ideas in Maths.
